

The Web Accessibility Directive

- In Malta ICT accessibility is covered under the Equal Opportunities Act of 2000 which prohibits discrimination against persons with disability under Article 4 – Goods and Services.
- 2. With the transposition of the Web Accessibility Directive the legal framework is strenghtened through provisions made specifically for the websites and mobile APPs owned by public entities.









The Web Accessibility Directive

- 1. Work on transposition is being concluded.
- 2. FITA recommended CIOs to implement self assessment and publish accessibility statements.
- 3. The Malta Communications Authority was entrusted with the implementation, enforcement and reporting
- 4. FITA was entrusted with assessments and providing assistance to public entities with addressing accessibility issues
 - Assessment includes use of automated tools and human testers using assistive technology products.
 - FITA reporting mechanism and standard report template were revised to include format suggested by the Accessible ICT Procurement Toolkit based on standard EU301549.
 - 3. FITA's previous roles in supporting private sector, education and public health services in the effective implementation of accessible ICT remain unchanged.









- 1. Malta Communications Authority and Parliamentary Secretariat for Persons with Disabilities and Active Ageing
 - Short courses for elderly and disabled persons on cost-effective communication tools such as Skype and email communication, Facebook, YouTube, online shopping and government e-Services.

 ICT Accessibility Hubs An extension of the ICT Pool service presently provided by FITA, where anyone including education and health professionals can try out and confirm the validity of assistive technology products based on user needs.
 - 1. Four centres (MCAST, SAPPORT, Ghajnsielem Centre, Public Library)
 - 2. ICT training in collaboration with EnableIreland









- 1. There are ongoing discussions to release the Maltese Speech Engine that FITA launched in 2012 as open source. This is being done in collaboration with KPMG Crimsonwing Plc and the University of Malta.
- 2. Persons with disability can apply to fund their purchase of ICT products that help them address the limitations caused by impairment, through two grant schemes:
 - a) The Malta Community Chest Fund
 - b) The Empowerment Scheme managed by SAPPORT









- 1. FITA, the Education Directorate and the Presidents Trust are collaborating on the testing, selection and funding of assistive ICT for school children with a vision impairment so as to help ensure their access to education.
- 2. The Access to Communication and Technology Unit (ACTU) provides an assessment service to children and young adults with a disability, including Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), in the area of Assistive Technology (AT) and Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC). ACTU is currently the sole trans-disciplinary team of assistive technology consultants which brings experience from a variety of backgrounds including occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, and education. The team operates both a unit based and home/school based service.












SPOT home screen with interactive map and quick search fields. Zooming in and out groups and ungroups venue pins












The map search with categories filter. Users may select any combination of main or subcategories.












Text based quick search feature. Plus a more in-depth search is available under the Venues menu












The advanced (text) search results page displaying summaries of matching venues.












Venue review page with dynamic questionnaire based on user selected disability groups. Here, the website's dark theme is active.
